

Rural Skills classes have also been making use of the orchard by creating frames for raspberries to grow up. While they were out there, they found a hedgehog family that has made the orchard their home.


What where your fondest memory's of your school life? Being inspired to become a teacher by my business studies teacher. Going to the Pancake place during free periods in S6 for a cup of tea!



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
